MENINGOCOCCAL DISEASE

Meningococcal disease is a medical emergency. It can kill in hours – so early treatment is vital. <u>Don't wait for the rash!</u> But be aware that there are two different sets of symptoms – depending on whether it takes the form of **meningitis**, or the more deadly **septicaemia** (poisoning of the blood). You may have several, or more, of the following symptoms:

SEPTICAEMIA MENINGITIS Shivering, chills, Stiff or painful cold hands/feet. neck rapid breathing Dislike of bright Pain in arms, legs, ioints or stomach lights **Fever** Nausea/vomiting Severe headache Maybe diarrhoea Lack of energy, **Drowsiness, loss** drowsiness, loss of conciousness of conciousness A pink or pinprick Same rash may develop in later rash (develops to purple blotches) stages



IN BABIES: Additional symptoms may include blotchy or pale skin, refusing to feed, fretfulness, a shrill or moaning cry, a floppy body, or a stiff body with jerky movements, a tense or bulging fontanelle (the soft spot on baby's head).







THE RASH: May start off as a spot, blister or pinpricks – later develops into purple bruise-like blotches.

Emergency treatment is vital!



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
